Some Lessons from 5th Country Program

“From previous programme cycles, it has been observed that the provision of **baseline data** at the commencement of a programme cycle with **yearly targets and benchmarks** to monitor implementation progress provides the means to measure performance and impact.”

Some Lessons from 5th Country Program

- A policy monitoring mechanism is required to facilitate policy implementation at appropriate levels.
- Assessment and evaluations carried out indicate:
 - an increase in ANC attendance (*how much*)
 - limited improvement occurring in number of deliveries recorded at health facilities (*how many*)
 - Introduction of the use of Magnesium Sulphate for the management of Eclampsia resulted in significant declines (*by how much*) in Eclampsia related maternal mortalities
 - use of anti-shock garments were found effective in reducing haemorrhages (*by how much*) during delivery.

Key Achievements of the 5th Country program - RH

- Facilitated the development and updating of critical policies and strategic plans (*Implementation? : the delivery of free maternal health care services in 5 states*)
- Conducted a Fistula Fortnight in Katsina, Kano, Sokoto and Kebbi (594 fistula clients repaired), Ebonyi State 400 patients repaired
- Strengthened technical and managerial capacity of 3,149 national partners in RH/FP/HIV services (*Results, Impact, Achievements?,*)
- Supplied contraceptive commodities to 5,000 service delivery centers in the public health care sector*Use?*
- Provided basic reproductive health equipment to 2,500 primary and 225 secondary health centres in the 15 programme states (*Data on use? morbidity and mortality averted?*)

Key Achievements of the 5th Country program – P&D

- Supported revision of the National Population Policy and its Strategic Plan of Action; *Implementation?*
- Provided technical and financial support for the execution of the 2006 population and housing census, including the training of 250 technical personnel;
- Supported the integration of population, reproductive health and gender issues into NEEDS and SEEDS (4 CP States)
- facilitated review of National Youth Policy *(implementation?)*
- supported the establishment of various networks: National Youth Network on HIV/AIDS (NYNETHA), Network of Islamic Organization on Population and Development. *(Results, Impact, Achievements?,)*

Key Achievements of the 5th Country program – Gender

- Supported formulation of National Gender Policy and Strategic Implementation Framework – *Implementation?*
- Supported passage of bills on the prohibition of harmful widowhood rites, female genital cutting and violence against women - *evidence of impact*
- Supported the commencement of parliamentary processes targeted at the domestication of CEDAW, including conveyance of public hearings, attendance of periodic CEDAW defences - *outcomes?*
- Established partnership with stakeholders to build their capacity as Gender equality advocates (include the Nigerian Movie Industry (Nollywood), Media and Traditional Communicators) – *Results?*
- Initiated collaborations with Women Parliamentarians and Women Pioneers to advocate for gender equality and work towards eliminating all forms of gender based violence. *Results?*

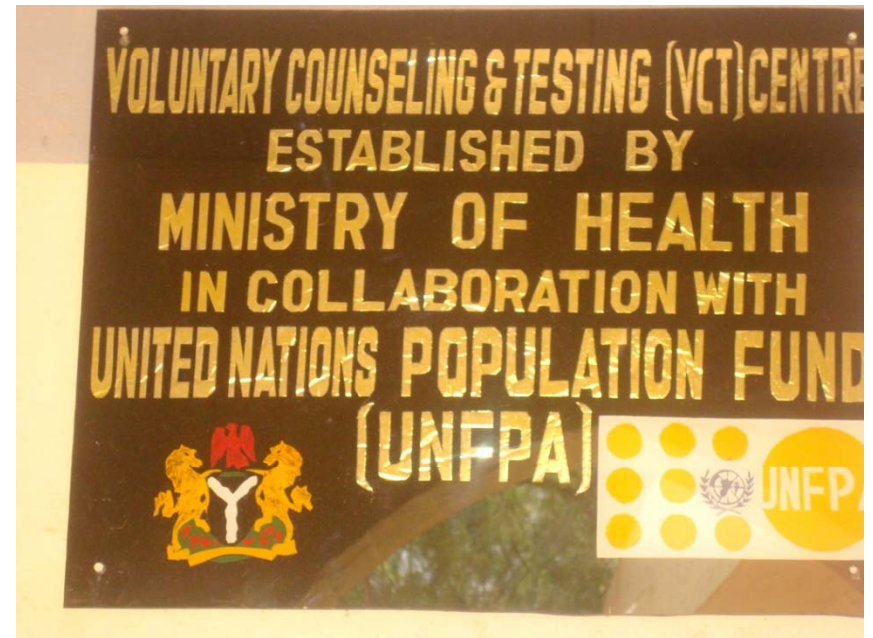


Proposed Key Indicators for Monthly, Quarterly and Annual Reports from each of the 12 States Supported by UNFPA



Proposed Key Indicators for the 6th Country program – RH

1. No of facilities supported¹
*(equipped for CEmOC, CEmONC and BEOC services, trained staff , supplies (record files, furniture, computers etc) by UNFPA to provide **gender sensitive and culturally appropriate quality maternal health services including Emergency obstetric and neonatal care***
2. Proportion or no of births assisted by skilled personnel in UNFPA Supported health facilities *(disaggregate by age, type of delivery and outcome)*

3. Number of persons receiving FP services *(disaggregate data by age, sex and type of method)*
4. Selective stock-out rate of RH commodities
5. Numbers Trained in RH curriculums *(disaggregate data by age, sex and type of training)*

Proposed Key Indicators for the 6th Country program – P&D

6. Number of relevant Population, RH and Gender policies and laws enacted, disseminated and operationalised at Federal and 12 state levels
7. No of comprehensive youth-friendly centres established/functional (*report also on 3&4 above*)
8. Proportion of resources allocated for the implementation of youth policies and programmes
9. Numbers Trained (*disaggregate data by age, sex and type of training*)



Proposed Key Indicators for the 6th Country program – Gender

10. Number of facilities supported by UNFPA to provide shelter for victims of GBV (Women and Children)
11. Number of victims of GBV (Women and Children) provided with shelter from GBV
12. No of Policy makers, Parliamentarians and civil society organizations members trained to promote gender equality and women empowerment.
13. % of sectoral plans with dedicated budget allocations for gender equality issues



Strategy for Regular Monitoring and Reviews for Performance and Results

1. Monthly Progress Reports from each Zone or Supported States (emphasis on agreed minimum indicators plus success stories and other key activities as in the work plans)
2. Quarterly Review meetings and progress reports with presentation on performance progress from each Zone or Supported States (emphasis on agreed minimum indicators plus success stories and other key activities as in the work plans)
3. Annual Progress Review meetings and Reports (Emphasis as above)
