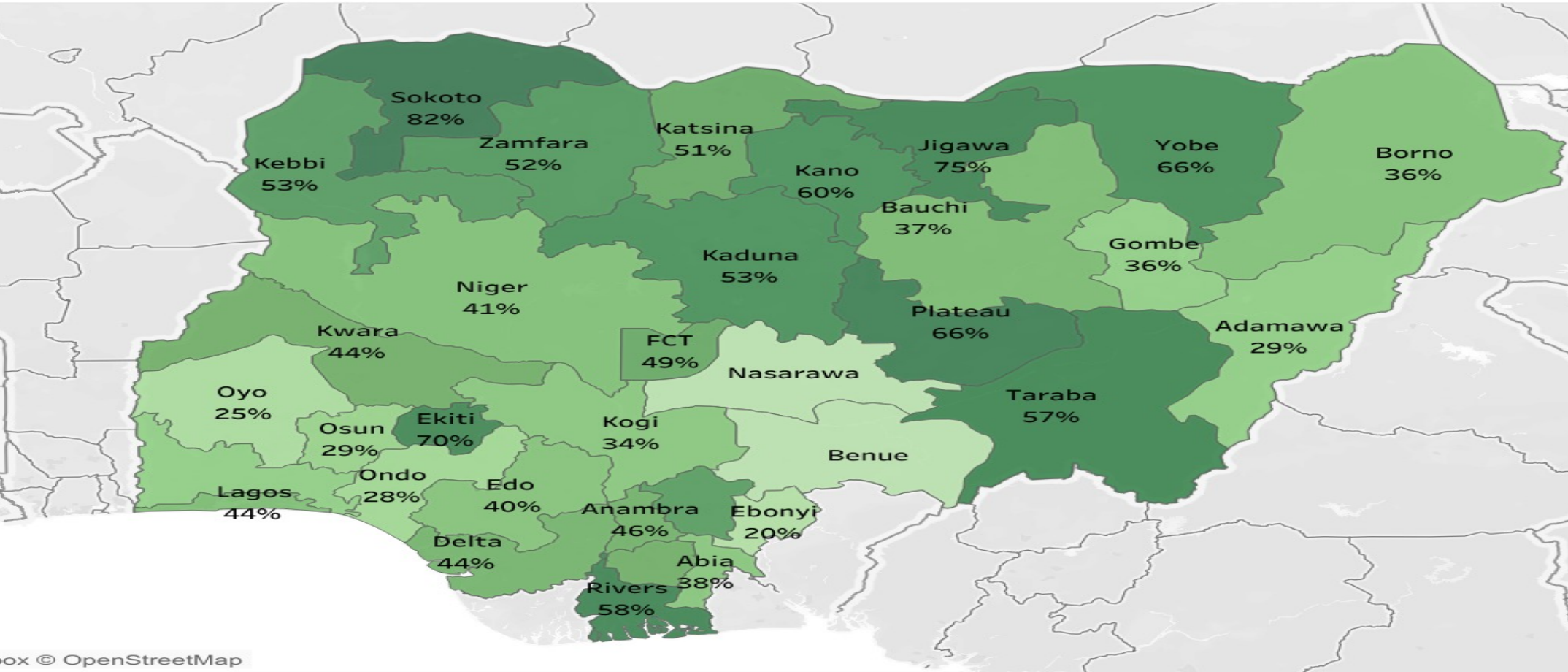
# Overview

- The 65th regular session of the National Council on Health (NCH) Meeting was held at the Mohammad Indimi Centre for Distance Learning, University of Maiduguri, Borno State, from 18th – 22nd November 2024.
- Following extensive deliberations by Council, 18 memoranda were approved, and 40 were noted for responsible entities to comply and commenced immediate implementation.
- To report on the status of the implementation of these resolutions, the Department of Health Planning, Research and Statistics developed and deployed a checklist to track all the resolutions for the implementing DAPs at all levels.
- The reports so presented are mainly through self-reporting and review of proxy reports from 34 states, and the FCT (No response from Akwa-Ibom Cross River States) with few Federal DAPs. The findings shows that the resolutions are at different stages of implementation as represented in the map.

## The 65<sup>th</sup> NCH Resolutions

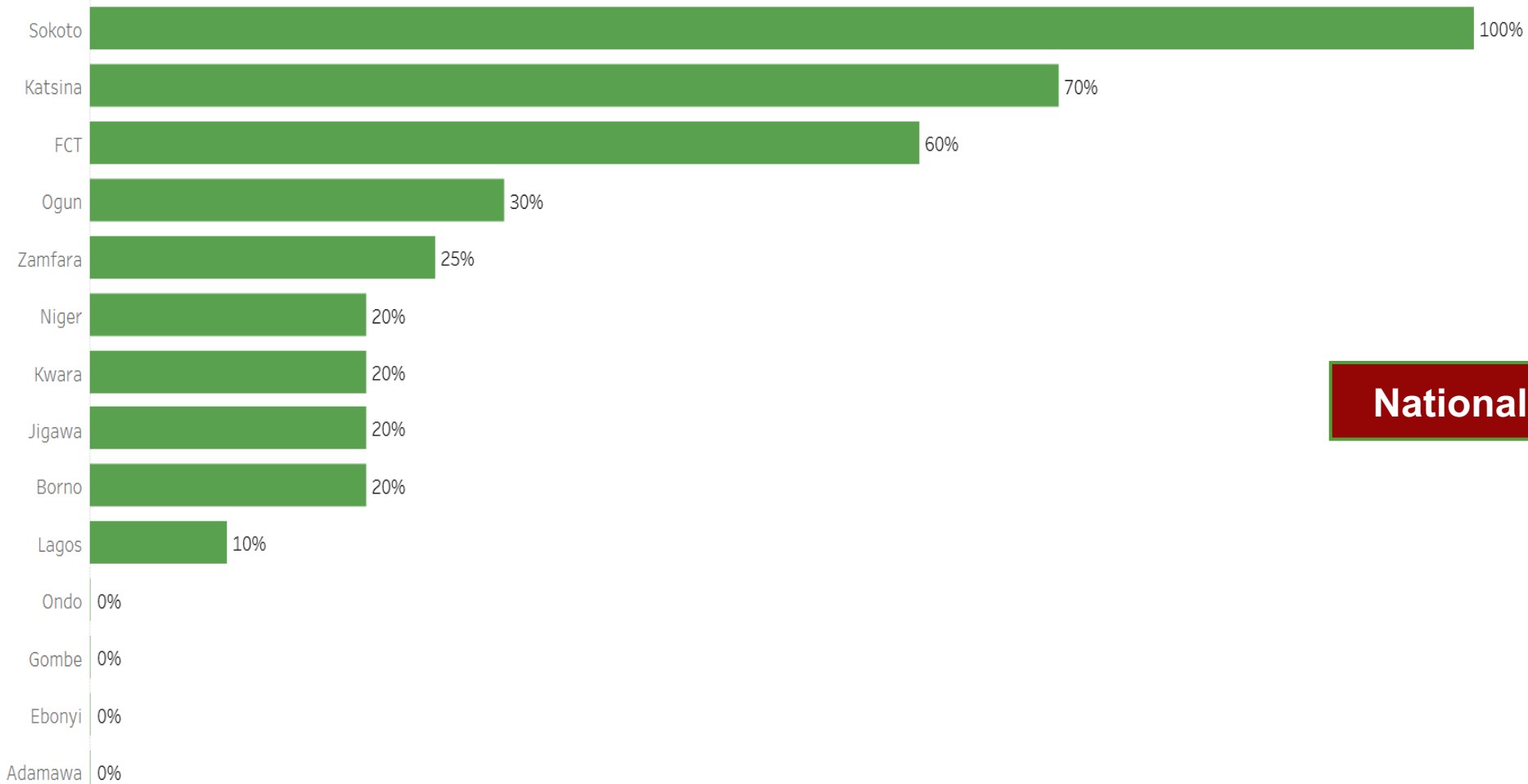

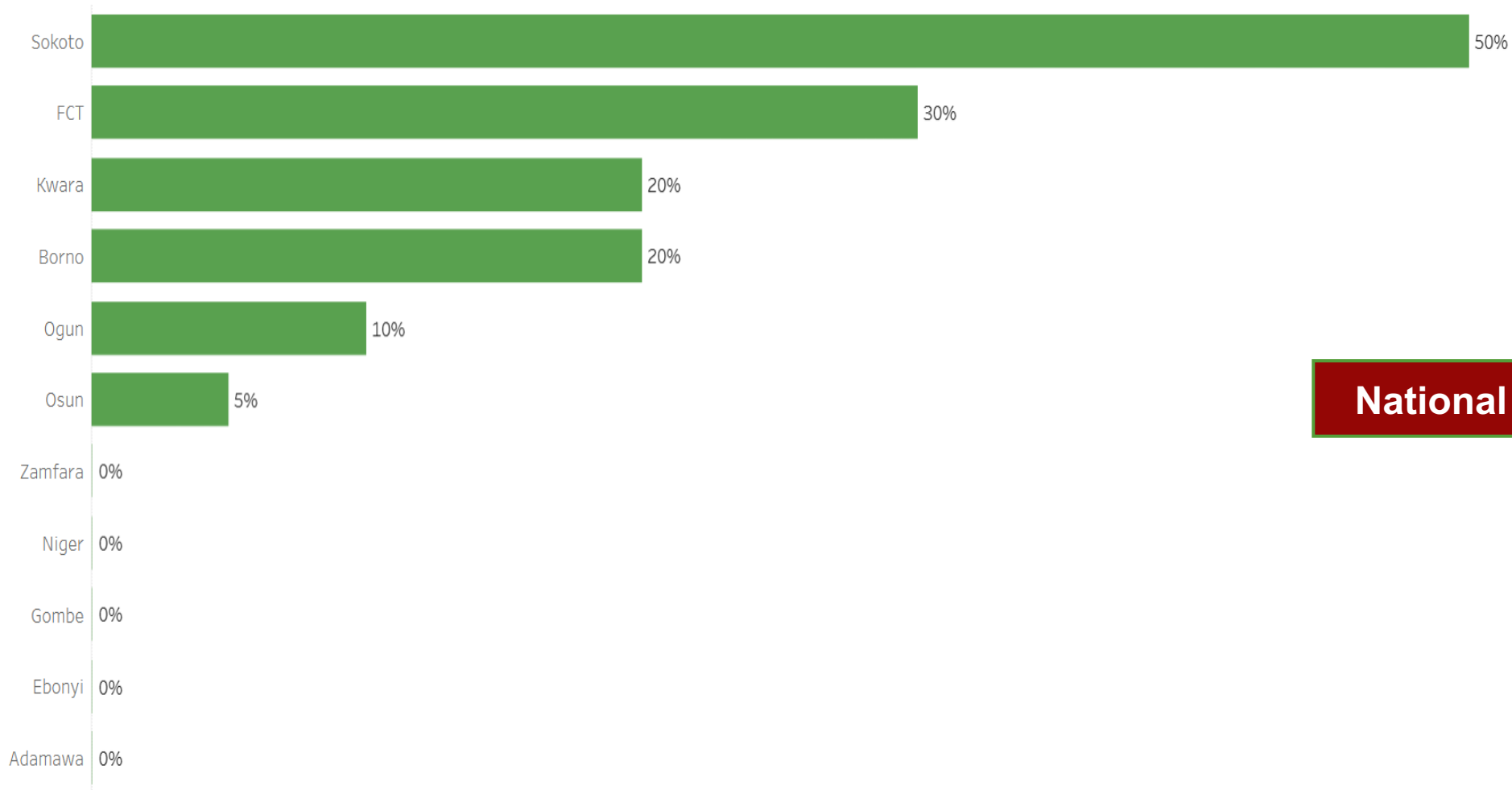

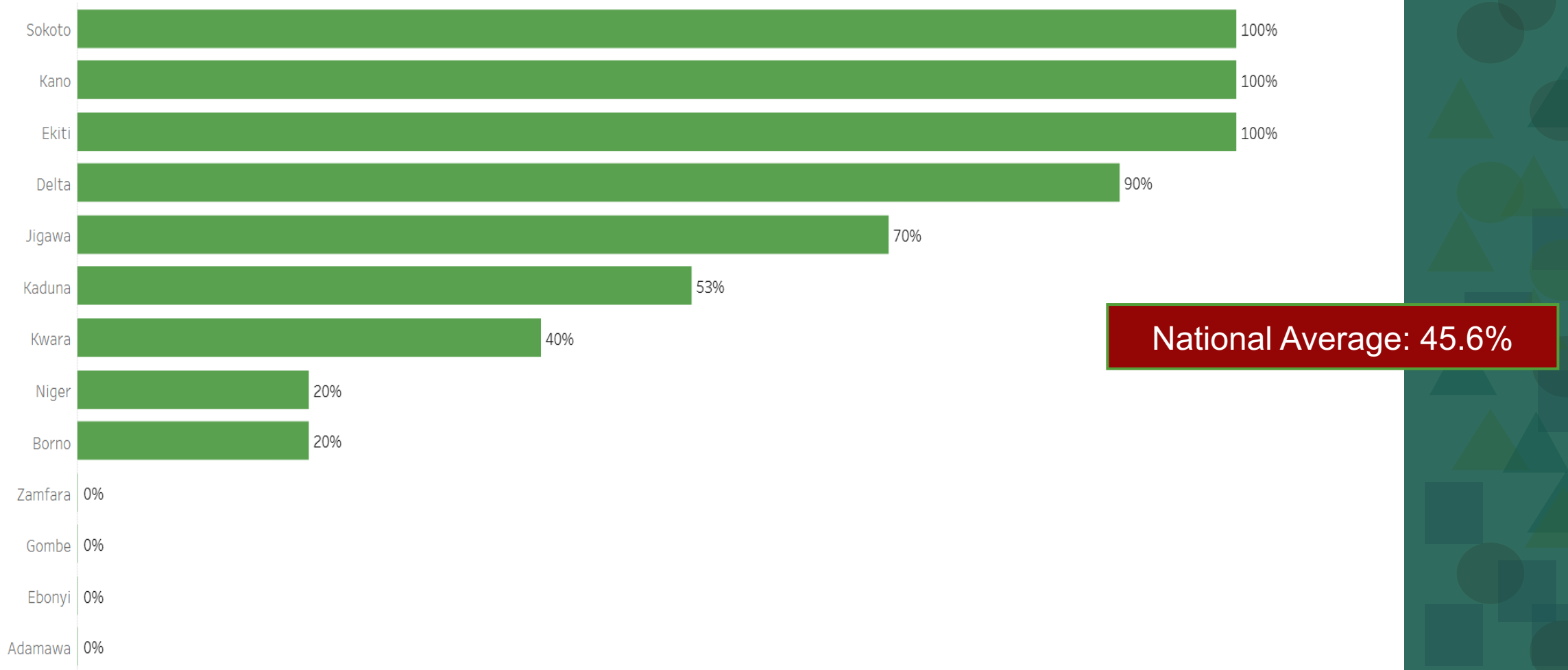

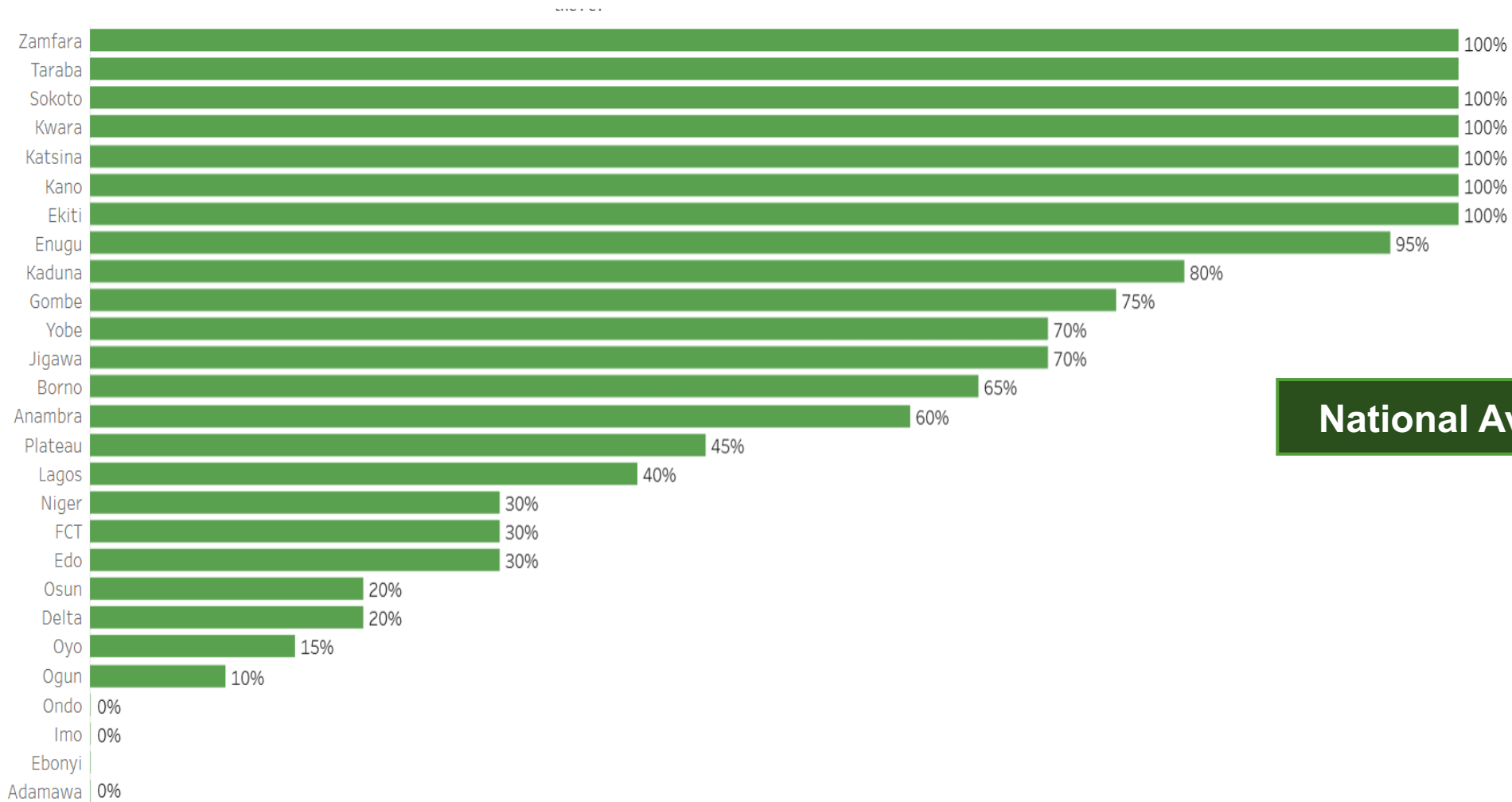

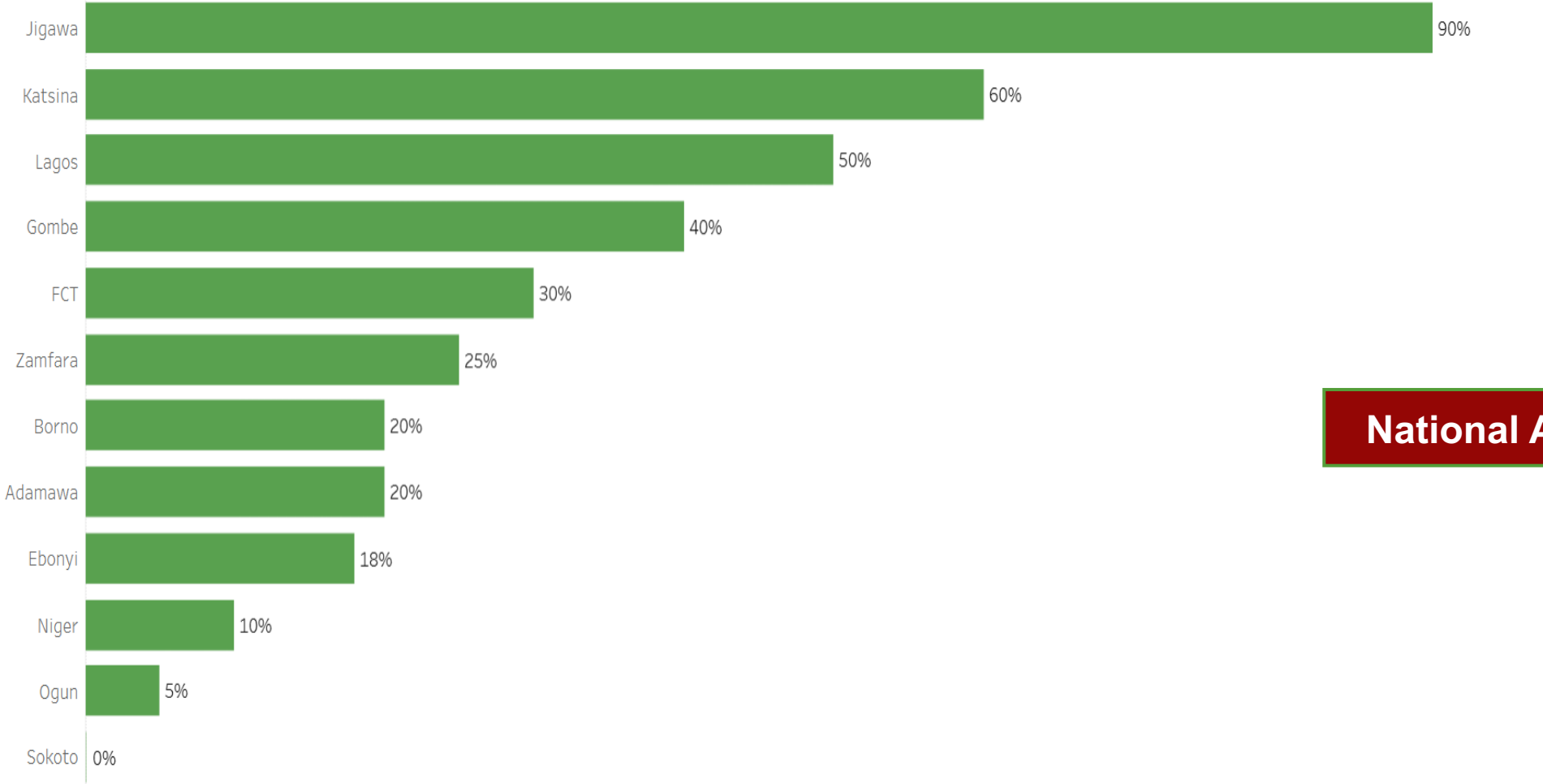

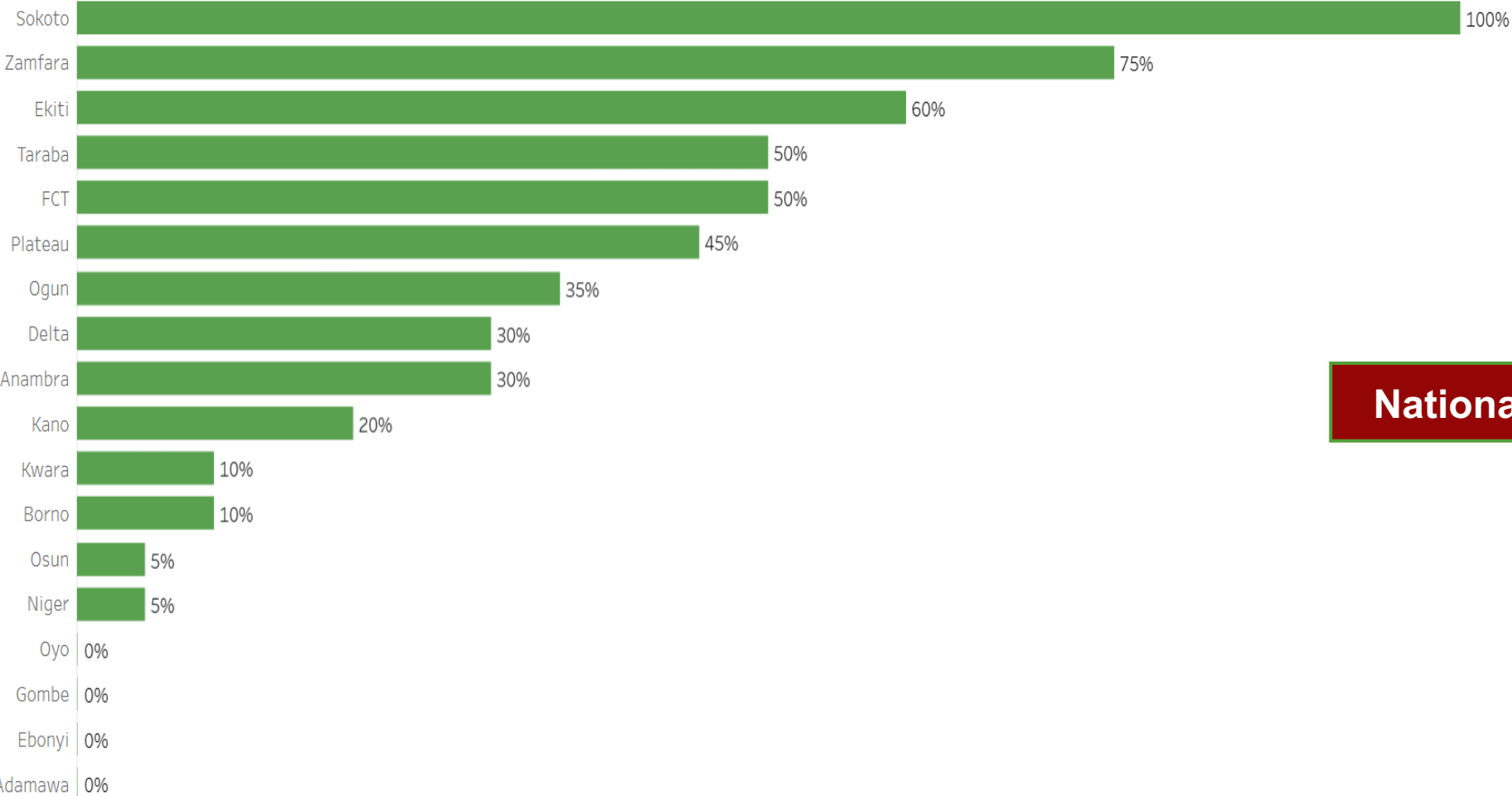

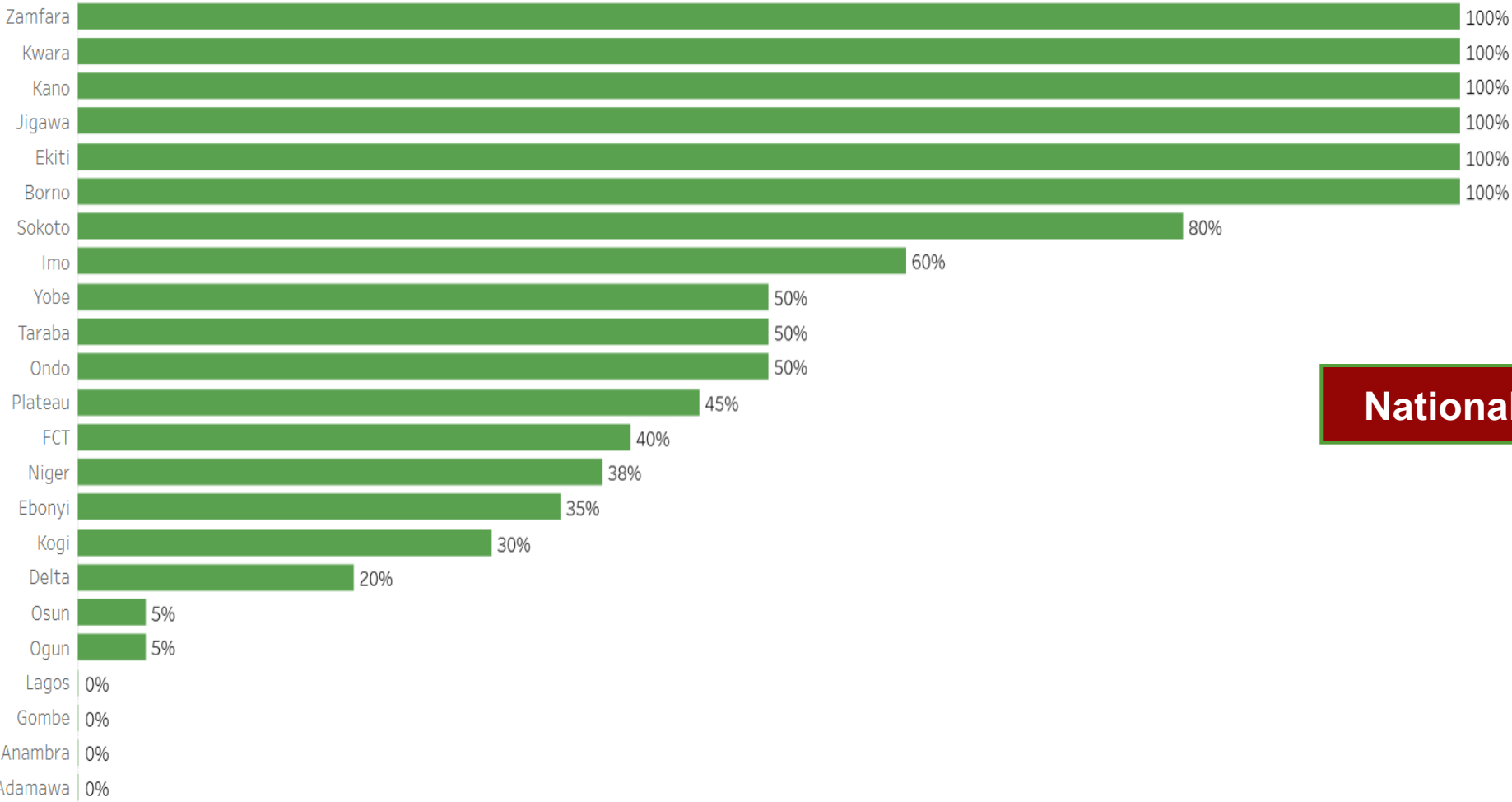

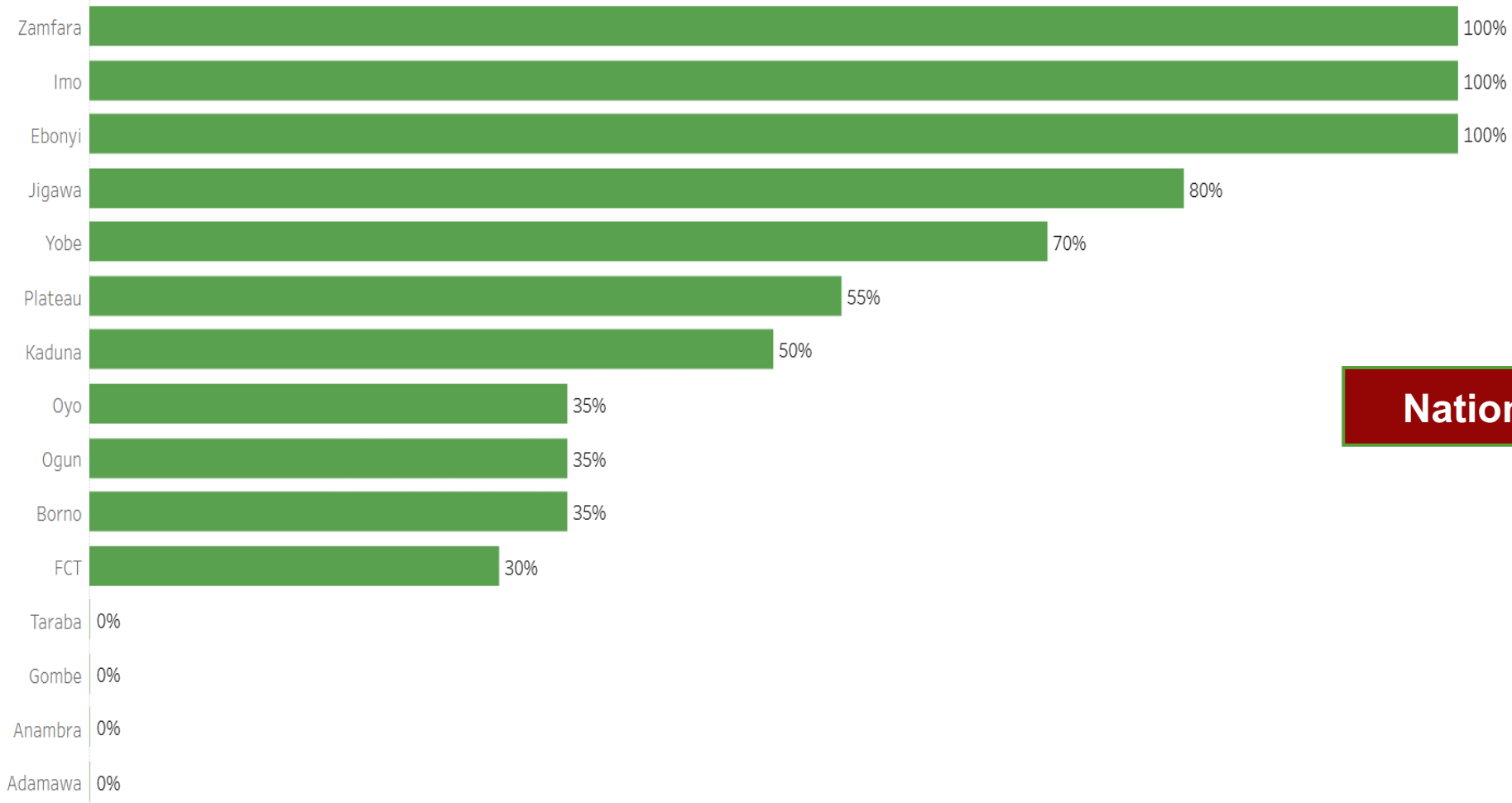

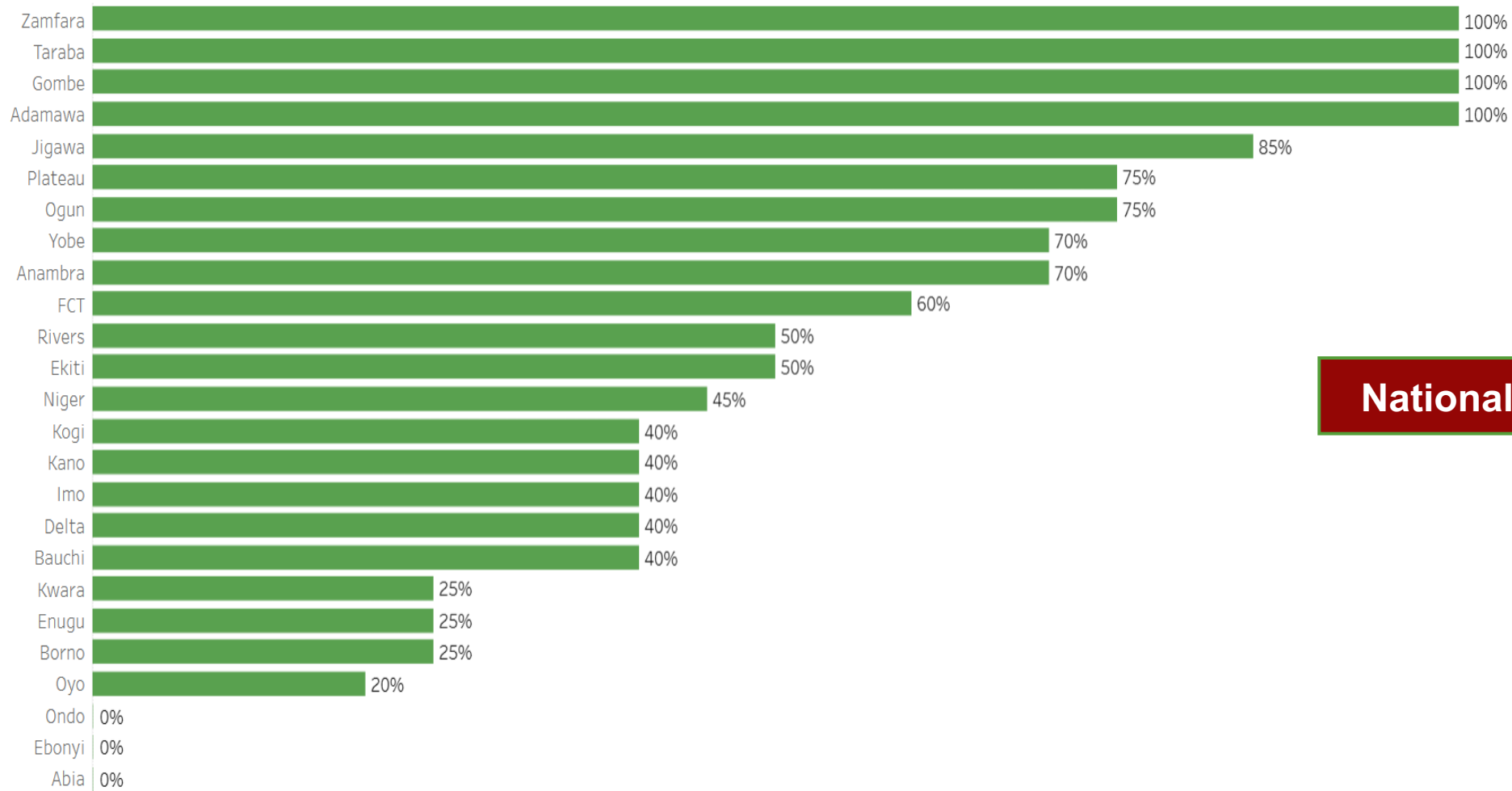

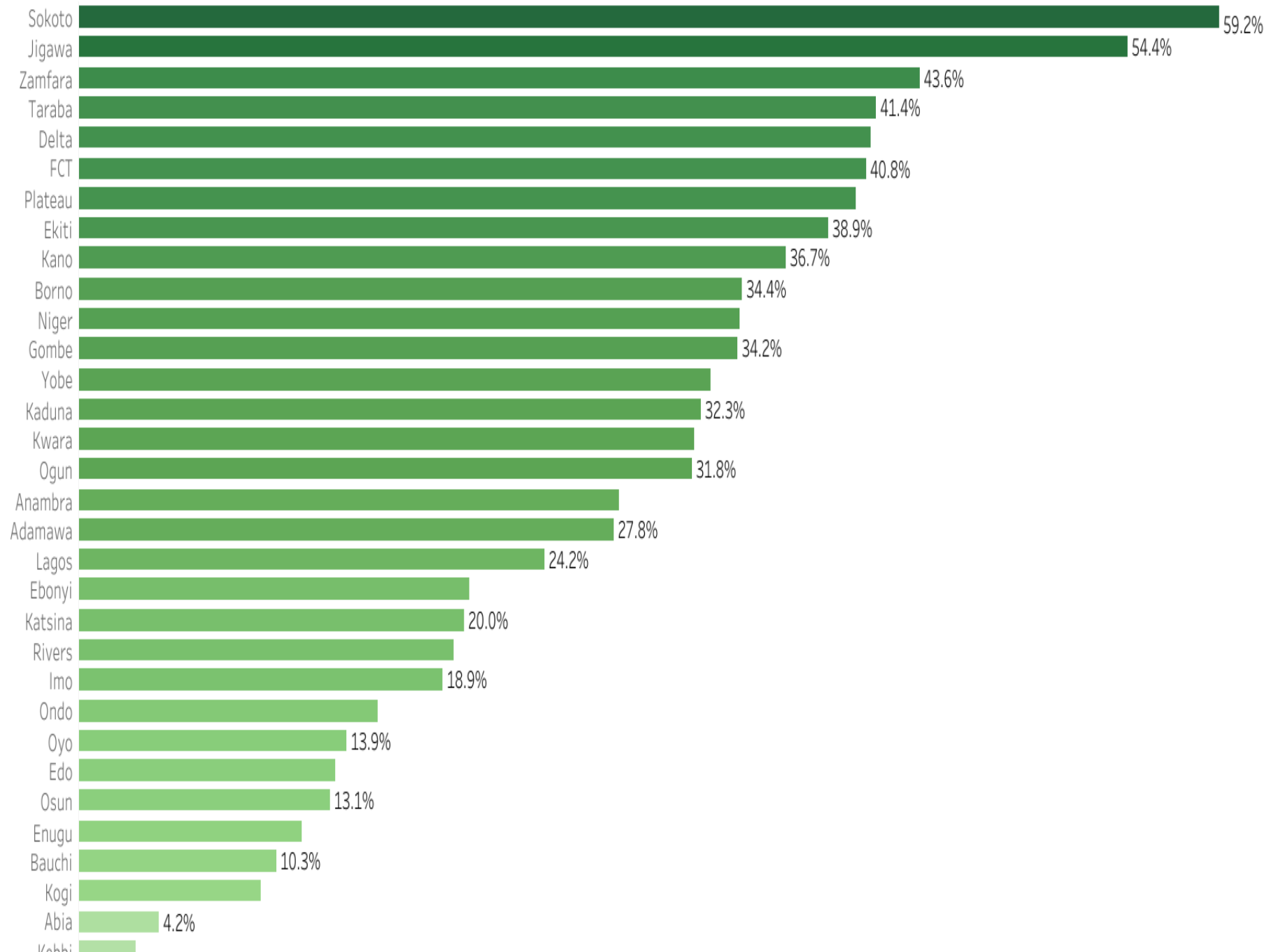
